He reminded me of a child staring in a department store window at Christmas dreaming about the possibilities of his upcoming good fortune. He did not seem frightened by the people coming in and going out; he made no attempt to make contact with anyone. He just stood there looking in the door.

In that instant the Lord impressed something upon my heart. Here was an animal hanging around a place that was dangerous for him. For one thing, a car could easily hit him. Let's face it, you do not expect to see a rooster walking around the streets of Martinsville. In addition, I expect that rooster would have high-tailed it out of there if he had realized that Hardees was a place that had taken the life of a lot of his kinfolk. I ask the manager if they had begun raising their own chickens, but he did not seem to find that humorous. Sadly, that rooster is a lot like us humans. On occasion we wander into an area that is not beneficial to us. Anytime we frequent a place that has the hint of danger (spiritually speaking) we jeopardize our well-being. Lot did this when he ventured into Sodom and Gomorrah. Samson did this when he laid his head on Delilah's lap. David did this when he chose to not be with his army in battle and encountered Bathsheba. Judas did this when he approached the High priest with a proposition. I could go on but you get the picture. We, too, do this when we entertain anything that is not within the will of God for our lives or that violates God's prescribed commands found in the Bible. An alcoholic must not allow himself to be around alcohol. A person easily swayed by a friend must limit the time he/ she spends around that person. I think this is what Paul had in mind when he warned believers to "Abstain from the appearance of evil" (1Thess. 5:22).

Are you headed toward a dangerous place in your life? Are you presently hanging out somewhere that is detrimental to your wellness? If so I admonish you to stop, turn around, and run as fast as you can toward the Lord. The Bible tells us God is our Rock, our fortress, our high tower, our deliverer, "and *the One* in whom I take refuge" (Ps 144:1-2). I promise you that God will never turn you away when you come to Him. I pray we all will have the good sense to choose Jesus in every situation. Blessings in Christ.

## *7 Week Ladies Bible Study*

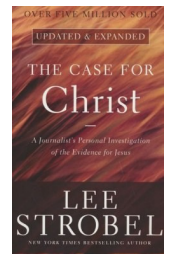
## Book of the Month

### "The Case for Christ"

By Lee Strobel

Is there credible evidence that Jesus of Nazareth really is the Son of God?

Now a major motion picture, in *Case for Christ*, Strobel retraces his own spiritual journey from atheism and former legal editor of the Chicago Tribune to faith. Strobel cross-examines a dozen experts with doctorates from schools like Cambridge, Princeton, and Brandeis who are recognized authorities in their own fields. He challenges them with questions like, *how reliable is the New Testament? Does evidence for Jesus exist outside the Bible? Is there any reason to believe the resurrection was an actual event?*

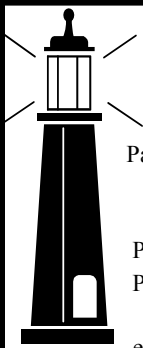
