A CONVERSATION WITH GOD

Have you ever had a conversation with God? Note, I did not ask if you ever prayed to God. There is a big difference in these two actions.

Prayer is wonderful and we are encouraged to "pray without ceasing" (1 Thess. 5:17). But prayer is not a conversation. A conversation involves two different beings. When I have a conversation with Ian both she and I are injecting our thoughts and opinions about a particular topic. When I pray to God, I am the only one talking. Please don't misunderstand me, prayer is vital to our lives as God's children. However, just as important is a regular conversation with God. But how does that work?

We speak to God by sharing our thoughts, desires, needs, dreams, bewilderment, frustrations and a plethora of other human emotions with Him in prayer. But for the communication to be a conversation we must give God time to respond. How, you might ask. Well God can speak to us in several ways. First, He can speak thru His word. It is literally "breathed out" from the very mind of God (2 Tim. 3:16). It is not all God knows. But it is all we need to know for the time being. This is why it is imperative believers read, study, and meditate on the Word of God. Second, the Bible says that in the last days God has spoken thru His Son, Jesus (Heb. 1:1-2). We are able to understand things about life, death, God, our world, and ourselves by reading the things Jesus said and did as recorded in the Gospels. Third, God speaks to us thru the Holy Spirit. When we are saved, He comes to live inside us (Jn. 14:17). Jesus said that The Holy Spirit would "guide us into all truth" (Jn. 16:13). God's Spirit speaks to us through our conscience, helping us make the right decisions. Fourth, God often speaks to us thru nature. Paul tells us that because of creation, there is no excuse for people not knowing God or understanding things about God (Rom. 1:20). This is a regular way in which I hear God speak to me. I am forever being taught life lessons by watching something in nature.

There may be other ways in which God can speak to us (circumstances, other people, etc.), but we must be careful to not misinterpret the message thru those sources. What I want you to know is that we can have a real, meaningful conversation with God. The only thing keeping us from that is us. Take time each day to spend some personal, private time with the Father. You will be glad you did. Thanks friends. God bless and keep you.

Don't be afraid but instead embrace this. Carry the cross and God will guide you every step of the way. It may not be easy but God's got your back


