"The greatest book of inspiration and encouragement ever written, the Psalms, was birthed out of the heart of a man who determined he would not live in self-pity, but would put his faith in the Lord in his times of terror, and trust God to answer his prayer. David could not sit around blaming others, waiting for life to be fair and others to fight his battles. He had to stand up like a warrior in the midst of adversity and encourage himself in the Lord."

"David could not rely on others for his victory, and neither can we. As long as we are lethargic, indifferent, and lack responsibility, we will never fulfill our destiny. A warrior mentality does not exempt us from difficult circumstances, or even setbacks. It causes us to rise to a new height. It will cause us to realize that the past is dead, as God said to Joshua, 'Moses My servant is dead. Now therefore, arise . . . every place that the sole of your foot will tread upon I have given you, as I said to Moses'" (Josh. 1:2-3).

"What has God promised you? Do you have a vision for victory for your life? If you will live by the promises of God, meditate on His Word, and determine that you will allow nothing to keep you from becoming everything God has created you to be, then you will, indeed, develop a warrior spirit. You will stand against the forces of darkness, look them squarely in the face, and encourage yourself in the Lord. David faced adversity and said, "I am going to pursue, overtake, and recover all" (1 Sam. 30:8). And so will you." 


